**Poverty".** This presentation will discuss current efforts across the United States to remove and

erase poor and homeless people from public and private spaces. Recent state and federal legislation have made being poor a criminal act. Legislation in Tennessee makes sleeping in public a felony, punishable to up to 6 years in prison. The Supreme Court recently ruled that putting people in prison only for being poor does not constitute cruel or unusual punishment. We will discuss the different ways erasing the poor is being carried out in the United States, how governments have made this legal, and what efforts can be made to combat this.
